### WEEK IN REVIEW – SOUTH BEND

South Bend, Indiana -- The United States Attorney's Office announced today that:

#### DISPOSITIONS:

- Aaron Johnson, 27, of Elkhart, Indiana, was sentenced by Judge Robert Miller, Jr. to 15 months imprisonment and 3 years of supervised release after pleading guilty to the felony offense of being a felon in possession of a firearm. Johnson has a prior conviction for possession of marijuana in 2007. This case was the result of an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives. This case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Donald Schmid.
- Jessie James Warren, 32, of South Bend, Indiana, was sentenced by Judge Robert Miller, Jr. to 79 months imprisonment and 3 years of supervised release after pleading guilty to the felony offense of being a felon in possession of a firearm. Warren has prior convictions for aggravated battery and carrying a handgun without a license in 2004. This case was the result of an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives and the South Bend Police Department. This case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Donald Schmid.
- Gary Marshall, 57, of Winimac, Indiana, was sentenced by Judge Robert Miller, Jr. to 6 months imprisonment and 2 years of supervised release after pleading guilty to the felony offense of being a felon in possession of a firearm. Marshall has previous convictions for filing fictitious claims against the United States and transporting in interstate commerce a falsely made security. This case was the result of an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives. This case was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Frank Schaffer.
