Application deadlines range from March 3, 2011 through April 28, 2011

The United States Attorney for the Western District of Louisiana, Stephanie A. Finley, and the U. S. Department of Justice/Office of Justice Programs (OJP) announce the availability of grant funding through Open Grant Program Solicitations. Grants are available for funding of various programs designed to better our community in the Western District of Louisiana by assisting in gun crime and gang violence reduction, reducing recidivism rates among juveniles and adults, mentoring programs for juveniles and adults, capital case litigation, Indian tribal governments, solving missing and unidentified persons cases, violent crime "cold" cases, research through forensic science, violent crimes and victims thereof, and internet crimes against children (ICAC).
