

ATTACHMENT A

On or about May 21, 2010, in the District of New Jersey, and elsewhere, defendant

RAMESH ADVANI

in the special maritime and territorial jurisdiction of the United States, did knowingly and intentionally engage in and cause sexual contact within the meaning of Title 18, United States Code Section 2246(3) (namely, the intentional touching, directly and through the clothing, of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, and buttocks of another person, namely, G.W., with an intent to abuse, humiliate, harass, degrade, arouse and gratify the sexual desire of any person), which would violate section 2242 of Title 18 had the sexual contact been a sexual act, without G.W.'s permission.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2244(a)(2) and Section 2.

ATTACHMENT B

I, Ajit David, a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (“FBI”), having conducted an investigation and discussed this matter with other law enforcement officers who have participated in this investigation, have knowledge of the following facts. Because this Complaint is being submitted for the limited purpose of establishing probable cause, I have not included each and every fact known to me concerning this investigation. I have set forth only the facts, which I believe are necessary to establish probable cause:

1. On or about Thursday, May 20, 2010, Continental Airlines Flight Number 98 (the “Flight”) departed from Hong Kong en route to Newark Liberty International Airport.
2. The Flight was an aircraft belonging to Continental Airlines. Continental Airlines is a corporation created by and under the laws of the United States or a State, Territory, District, and possession thereof.
3. Defendant Ramesh Advani was a male passenger on the Flight, sitting in or around seat 36D. A female passenger (the “Victim”) was seated next to defendant Advani, in or around seat 36E.
4. After the Flight had departed from Hong Kong, and while the Flight was in flight over the high seas and over waters within the admiralty and maritime jurisdiction of the United States and out of the jurisdiction of any particular State:
 - a. The Victim fell asleep in the Victim’s seat. The Victim had a blanket covering the Victim’s body, from at least her chest down to at least her thighs.
 - b. Defendant Advani reached his hand under the Victim’s blanket, and knowingly and intentionally touched the Victim in the area of the Victim’s genitalia, groin, and inner thigh.
 - c. Defendant Advani then inserted one or more of his fingers into, and penetrated, the Victim’s vagina.
 - d. Two passengers (the “Witnesses”) sitting in the row directly behind Defendant Advani observed that defendant Advani had placed his hand underneath the Victim’s blanket in the area of the Victim’s genitalia.
 - e. The Witnesses observed, by looking between the seats, that after a period of time, defendant Advani took napkins and placed the napkins inside defendant Advani’s pants, and began moving the napkins around inside of his pants, in what appeared to be an effort to clean his genital area.
 - f. The Witnesses began kicking the Victim’s seat, in an attempt to alert the Victim as to what was occurring.

g. At some point thereafter, the Victim awoke, and felt that defendant Advani's finger had penetrated her vagina. The Victim got up from her seat, went to the bathroom, and then alerted the Flight's crew members as to what had happened to her.
