ATTACHMENT A

On or about December 6, 2010, in Essex County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, defendant REGINALD ANDERSON, with the intent to cause death and serious bodily harm, knowingly took a motor vehicle, namely a 2004 BMW X-5, that had been transported, shipped and received in interstate and foreign commerce, from the person and presence of another, namely G.A. and D.O., by force and violence and by intimidation.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2119 and Section 2.

## ATTACHMENT B

I, JASON CARLEY, am a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I have knowledge of the following facts based upon both my investigation and discussions with other law enforcement personnel and others. Where statements of others are set forth herein, these statements are related in substance and in part. Where I assert that an event took place on a particular date, I am asserting that it took place on or about the date alleged.

1. On Monday, December 6, 2010, at or around 1:30 a.m., a burgundy 2002 Jeep Cherokee Laredo was stolen from victim L.N. at gunpoint in Newark, Essex County, New Jersey (hereinafter the "Jeep Cherokee Carjacking"). L.N. later provided a statement to Newark police officers regarding the Jeep Cherokee Carjacking. According to L.N., he was parked on the street when a black male approached the driver's side of his car and tapped on the window with the barrel of a gun. The black male ordered L.N. to get out of the car. L.N. complied and exited the vehicle. After L.N. exited the vehicle, he saw a second black male. The first black male with the gun told the second black male to search L.N. L.N. indicated that he did not have any money and the second black male took L.N.'s cell phone from him. The two black males entered the Jeep Cherokee and drove away.

2. On Monday, December 6, 2010, at or around 1:00 p.m., a blue 2004 BMW X-5 was stolen from victims G.A. and D.O. at gunpoint in Newark, Essex County, New Jersey (hereinafter the "BMW Carjacking"). G.A. and D.O. later provided statements to law enforcement regarding the BMW Carjacking. According to G.A. and D.O., they were at a car dealership looking at a 2004 BMW X-5. G.A. was standing near the passenger side door of the vehicle. D.O. was standing inside the driver's side door. A burgundy Jeep Cherokee appeared and a black male with a handgun exited from the passenger side door. The black male ordered D.O. to move away from the car. Both G.A. and D.O. moved away from the car and the black male entered the vehicle and drove away. The burgundy Jeep Cherokee drove off behind the BMW.

3. On Tuesday, December 7, 2010, at or around 9:00 p.m., law enforcement from the Newark Police Department observed the burgundy Jeep Cherokee that had been reported stolen in connection with the Jeep Cherokee Carjacking traveling at a high rate of speed. They activated their lights and sirens and followed the Jeep Cherokee in an attempt to pull the vehicle over, but the Jeep Cherokee continued at a high rate of speed and did not stop for the officers. As the Jeep Cherokee approached Market Street and McCarter Highway in Newark, defendant REGINALD ANDERSON (hereinafter "ANDERSON") bailed out of the vehicle and fled on foot. The vehicle continued southbound on McCarter Highway. Law enforcement apprehended ANDERSON shortly thereafter.

4. The two remaining suspects in the Jeep Cherokee subsequently exited the vehicle and fled on foot. Law enforcement apprehended Suspect #1 after a foot chase. Suspect #2 was also apprehended.

5. After ANDERSON was arrested, six photographs, including a photograph of defendant ANDERSON, were shown sequentially to G.A., the victim of the BMW Carjacking. G.A. positively identified defendant ANDERSON as the individual with the gun that stole the BMW.

6. The 2004 BMW X-5 was not manufactured in New Jersey.
