ATTACHMENT A

On or about July 9, 2012, in Essex County, in the District of New Jersey and elsewhere, the defendant,

MICHAEL JOHN DAVIDSON

attempted to get on an aircraft in, and intended for operation in, air transportation and intrastate air transportation, had on and about the individual and the property of the individual a concealed dangerous weapon that had and would have been accessible to him in flight.

In violation of Title 49, United States Code, Section 46505(b).

ATTACHMENT B

I, Gary K. Borak, am a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI"). I am fully familiar with the facts set forth herein based on my own investigation, my conversations with other law enforcement officers, and my review of reports, documents, and items of evidence. Where statements of others are related herein, they are related in substance and part. Because this complaint is being submitted for a limited purpose, I have not set forth each and every fact that I know concerning this investigation. Where I assert that an event took place on a particular date, I am asserting that it took place on or about the date alleged.

1. On July 9, 2012, at the Lufthansa ticket counter at Newark Liberty International Airport, MICHAEL JOHN DAVIDSON ("DAVIDSON") purchased a one-way ticket using \$2,643.32 in cash for Lufthansa flight number 409, which was scheduled to depart shortly after the ticket purchase to Düsseldorf, Germany, and then connecting to Budapest, Hungary.

2. Due to the circumstances of his ticket purchase, DAVIDSON was selected for additional screening at the security checkpoint. While at the screening area, DAVIDSON repeatedly failed to follow the instructions of officers with the Transportation Security Administration.

3. An x-ray examination revealed what appeared to be a razor blade concealed within DAVIDSON's carry-on luggage. Upon further inspection, law enforcement found six razor blades concealed within the carry-on luggage.

4. After law enforcement found the razor blades, and while they continued to search his carry-on luggage, DAVIDSON was repeatedly instructed not to touch his property during the screening. Despite these instructions, however, DAVIDSON continued to obstruct law enforcement from searching the property.
