
This complaint is based on the following facts:

I, Greg Carrasco, being duly sworn, state that I am employed as a Detective with the Roswell Police Department and currently commissioned as a Task Force Agent (TFA) with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF). I have been so employed with the police department for eleven years. I am currently assigned to work in the Roswell, New Mexico area.

1. On February 7, 2010, at approximately 0200 hours (2:00am) Roswell Police Department (RPD) Sergeant Filomeno Gonzales observed a male subject standing between two vehicles in the Budget Inn, 2200 W 2<sup>nd</sup> Roswell NM, parking lot. Due to the suspicious activity, Sergeant Gonzales stopped and contacted the subject, who was identified as Shane LARSON DOB: 1979 SSN: 1829 Roswell NM. LARSON appeared to be nervous. RPD Officer Jerry Hart arrived to assist Sergeant Gonzales. LARSON stated that he was feeling ill and continued to reach for his waistband. Sergeant Gonzales began a "pat" search and felt a gun in LARSON's waistband. LARSON fell to the ground and was pulling away from the Officers. LARSON was detained and Sergeant Gonzales recovered a Glock, model 30, 45 caliber pistol, SN: MVX502 that was in a nylon holster from LARSON's waistband. The firearm was loaded with seven Winchester 45 caliber ammunition, with one of the cartridges in the chamber.
2. On February 9, 2010, TFA Carrasco received certified copies of Judgment and Sentences pertaining to LARSON from the Chaves County District Court Clerks Office. Upon review of Judgment and Sentence No. CR-2001-369, TFA Carrasco observed that LARSON was charged with the felony crimes of five (5) counts of Forgery, five (5) counts of Conspiracy, and one count of Tampering with Evidence from August 20, 2001 to August 24, 2001. On May 30, 2002, LARSON pled no contest to all charges and was sentenced to three years in the custody of the Department of Corrections followed by two years parole to each count of Forgery, eighteen months in the custody of the Department of Corrections followed by one year parole for each count of Conspiracy, and eighteen months in the custody of the Department of Corrections followed by one year parole for Tampering With Evidence. Upon review of Judgment and Sentence No. CR-2002-140, TFA Carrasco observed that LARSON was charged with the felony crimes of Aggravated Burglary and Receiving Stolen Property from September 9, 2001 to September 10, 2002. On May 30, 2002, LARSON pled no contest to both counts and was sentenced to nine years in the custody of the Department of Corrections followed by two years parole for Aggravated Burglary and eighteen months in the custody of the Department of Corrections followed by one year parole for Receiving Stolen Property.


3. On February 8, 2010, TFA Carrasco test fired the weapon pertaining to LARSON that being a Glock, model 30, 45 caliber pistol, SN: MVX502. The firearm was found to function as designed.
4. The firearm was manufactured by Glock and had the stampings of "MADE IN AUSTRIA" and "GLOCK INC., SMYRNA, GA.". TFA Carrasco knows through training and experience that Glock firearms are not and have never been manufactured in New Mexico. Therefore the firearm possessed by LARSON on February 7, 2010, traveled in and affected interstate commerce.
