AFFIDAVIT

- I, the undersigned, being duly sworn, hereby depose and state as follows:
- 1. I, Mark W. Buie, am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) currently assigned to the Santa Fe Resident Agency of the Albuquerque Division, to investigate violations of Federal Laws, including Title 18, United States Code, Section 2113(a). The information set forth in this affidavit has been derived from my own investigation or communicated to me by other sworn law enforcement officers or from other reliable sources.
- 2. On August 11, 2010 at approximately 4:48 a.m., the FBI in Albuquerque, New Mexico received a call from the Santa Fe Police Department reporting that the First National Bank of Santa Fe, a Federally insured institution, located at 2021 Cerrillos Road, Santa Fe, New Mexico had been broken into and may have been robbed.

- At approximately 7:55 a.m. on the same morning, your affiant arrived at the bank. Upon inspection of the front of the bank, it appeared that an individual had attempted to gain access to the Automatic Teller Machine (ATM) located on the front of the bank. The ATM was severely damaged with a broken monitor and tool marks as if an individual had attempted to forcibly remove the machine from the wall with a tool.
- Adjacent to the ATM, an exterior door to the bank showed extensive damage to the areas around the bolts and The damage appeared as if an individual had forcibly tried to pry open the door with a tool. On the southwest side of the bank, a glass exterior door of the bank was shattered. the west wall of the bank, the night depository box had minor damage, appearing as if an individual tried to gain access to the box by attempting to pry the box off of the wall with a tool. Ιn a building adjacent to the bank, also a First National Bank building, with an address of 2020 Rosina Street, an exterior window on the east side of the building was shattered.

- Your affiant reviewed surveillance video from the bank. Surveillance video indicated that at approximately 12:07 a.m., a white male with short dark hair, wearing a white t-shirt with writing across the front, attempted to gain access to the ATM previously mentioned. A short time later, surveillance vide on the inside of the bank showed a white male with short dark hair, wearing camouflage pattern shorts with a belt, and a plain white t-shirt with writing across the front of the shirt, had

shattered the exterior glass door and entered the bank through the southwest side. After entering the bank, the individual jumped over the teller counter and attempted to access drawers near the teller counters. The individual then departed the bank through the shattered southwest door.

At approximately 8:40 a.m., Officer Joseph LeBlanc of 6. the Santa Fe Police Department was outside of the bank assisting with the investigation. Officer LeBlanc noticed an individual walking on the sidewalk adjacent to the bank that appeared to match the description of the individual seen in the surveillance video mentioned previously. The individual is described as a white male with short brown hair, wearing camouflage shorts with a belt and a white t-shirt with writing on the front. Officer LeBlanc placed the individual into custody and brought him to the affiant. Upon approaching your affiant, the individual stated, "I did it, I'm gonna be honest with you." as he nodded his head towards the bank. He further stated, "I'm going to be honest with you, I'm sorry." This individual was identified as LUKE KORZEC, year of birth, 1981, Social Security Account Number, XXX-XX-1816.

7. KORZEC provided additional information about the attempted robbery. KORZEC advised that on the previous night (early morning) he got drunk and needed some money. KORZEC first went to a chili roasting machine located on the north side of the bank and broke off the handle. After obtaining the handle of the chili roasting machine to use as a tool, KORZEC attempted to

break into the ATM located in front of the bank. KORZEC was unsuccessful in obtaining any money from the machine.

8. After failing to gain access to the ATM, KORZEC attempted to gain access to the bank through an exterior door adjacent to the ATM. KORZEC was unsuccessful in entering the bank through this door. KORZEC then went to the southwest side of the bank and shattered a glass door, which also tripped the burglar alarm. After entering the bank, KORZEC hopped over the teller window and tried to find money in the drawers where tellers keep their money. KORZEC found a key in a drawer and took it. KORZEC was showed a still photograph of the individual that entered the bank. KORZEC advised that the person in the photograph was him. KORZEC was not able to obtain any money from the bank.

9. After being interviewed, KORZEC showed the agents where he had hidden the handle from the chili roasting machine and the key which he had taken from the bank and these items were retrieved.

Based on the information set forth in this affidavit, your affiant submits that there is probable cause to believe that LUKE KORZEC did unlawfully enter or attempt to enter a bank and intended to commit a felony or larceny in the First National Bank of Santa Fe, New Mexico on August 11, 2010.

Your affiant further submits that this attempted robber was
