AFFIDAVIT

I, the undersigned, being duly sworn, hereby depose and state as follows:

1. I am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), United States Department of Justice. I have been so employed since April 13, 2008. As such, I am a law enforcement officer of the United States.

2. My experience as a Special Agent includes, but is not limited to, conducting surveillance; interviewing witnesses; participating in arrests, searches, and seizures; and working with undercover agents and informants. I have received training and have experience in the investigation of violations of the federal drug and money laundering laws, including the offenses listed below. I have participated in the investigation of several drug trafficking conspiracies. As a result, I am familiar with matters including, but not limited to, the means and methods used by persons and drug trafficking organizations to purchase, transport, store, and distribute drugs and to hide profits generated from those transactions.

3. On August 20, 2009, confidential sources (CSs) ordered two ounces of cocaine and two ounces of crack cocaine, base cocaine, from ERIK ALONSO to be delivered on August 21, 2009. Prior to the transaction, surveillance observed a blue Pontiac


1 G6, bearing New Mexico license plate (NMLP) KXD 376, registered to ERIK ALONSO  
2 arrive at 1743 Rayo Del Sol SW, Albuquerque, New Mexico, hereafter referred to as the  
3 residence. A red Ford F-150, bearing NMLP 12 UNM 98, registered to NORA ALONSO,  
4 was also observed exiting and entering the residence prior to the controlled narcotics  
5 purchase. ALONSO called one of the CSs, hereafter referred to as CS1, and said that he  
6 would arrive at the predetermined location in ten minutes. Subsequent to the telephone call,  
7 the blue Pontiac G6 departed the residence. Approximately ten minutes later, the blue  
8 Pontiac G6 arrived at the predetermined meeting location, and two males, later identified as  
9 ALONSO and JORGE LOZOYA, exited the vehicle. ALONSO pointed to the CSs' vehicle  
10 and instructed LOZOYA to do the transaction with CS1. LOZOYA entered the CSs'  
11 vehicle with CS1 and provided CS1 with two baggies containing a white powdery  
12 substance, purported cocaine, and one baggie containing a yellowish, rock-like substance,  
13 purported cocaine base, in exchange for \$4,000.00 in United States (U.S.) currency provided  
14 by CS1. Subsequent to the transaction, the blue Pontiac G6 was observed returning directly  
15 to the residence. Following the operation, the substances field tested positive for cocaine.  
16 The two baggies containing cocaine weighed 29.4 grams/gross weight each and the baggie  
17 containing cocaine base weighed 49.5 grams/gross weight.

19 4. On September 2, 2009, CS1 ordered two ounces of cocaine and two ounces  
20 of crack cocaine, cocaine base, from ALONSO to be delivered on September 3, 2009. Prior  
21 to the transaction, surveillance observed the blue Pontiac G6 arrive at the residence.  
22 Approximately nine minutes later, the blue Pontiac G6 departed the residence.  
23 Approximately twelve minutes after leaving the residence, the blue Pontiac G6 was  
24 observed arriving at the predetermined meeting location. Three males, later identified as  
25 ALONSO, LOZOYA and GUSTAVO Last Name Unknown (LNU), exited the vehicle and  
26 met with CS1 and a second CS, hereafter referred to as CS2. LOZOYA and CS1 entered the  
27 CSs' vehicle and LOZOYA then provided CS1 with one baggie of a white powdery  
28 substance, purported cocaine, and one baggie of a yellowish, rock-like substance, purported


1 cocaine base, in exchange for \$4,000.00 in U.S. currency. Subsequent to the transaction, the  
2 blue Pontiac G6 was observed returning directly to the residence. Following the operation,  
3 the substances field tested positive for cocaine. The baggie containing cocaine weighed  
4 58.5 grams/gross weight and the baggie containing cocaine base weighed 60.8 grams/gross  
5 weight.

7 5. Based on the information set forth in this affidavit, your affiant submits that  
8 there is probable cause to arrest ERIK ALONSO MARTINEZ for knowingly and  
9 intentionally distributing a controlled substance, cocaine base, in violation of Title 21,  
10 United States Code, section 841(a)(1).
