United States Attorney Richard S. Hartunian announced today the sentencing of a Nedrow man for conspiracy to possess and possess with intent to distribute marijuana.

CARL DUBY, 25, of Nedrow, New York, was sentenced today by Senior United States District Judge Frederick J. Scullin to a term of 37 months imprisonment for his plea of guilty to conspiring to possess with intent to distribute and distribute between 100 and 400 kilograms of marijuana between August and December 2008. DUBY played a large role in a marijuana conspiracy in which well over 100 kilograms of marijuana was brought from the Akwesasne Mohawk Indian Reservation (AMIR), near the U.S./Canadian border, to the Onondaga Indian Reservation in Nedrow, New York. In his role as a co-conspirator, DUBY received portions of the loads of marijuana delivered to co-conspirators and then re-sold the marijuana, in smaller quantities, to Syracuse area customers.

After DUBY finishes serving his 37 month sentence of incarceration, he will be placed on supervised release for a period of 4 years. DUBY was also ordered to pay a special assessment of \$100.

The DUBY case investigated by the Syracuse Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office.
