**FORMER TRUSTEE OF MAILERS UNION SENTENCED IN MANHATTAN
FEDERAL COURT TO ONE YEAR IN PRISON FOR
EMBEZZLING UNION FUNDS**

PREET BHARARA, the United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York, announced today that LARRY DeANGELIS was sentenced to one year and a day in prison in connection with a scheme to embezzle from the Communication Workers of America Union, Local 14170, commonly known as New York Mailers Union No. 6 (the "Mailers Union,") a local union that represents mailroom employees of New York-based newspapers, including, among others, the *New York Times*, the *New York Post* and the *Daily News*. United States District Judge RICHARD M. BERMAN imposed the sentence today in Manhattan federal court. According to documents filed in Manhattan federal court:

In June 2008, LARRY DeANGELIS was appointed to manage the Mailers Union's financial affairs, after the resignation of WAYNE MITCHELL, the president of the union.

DeANGELIS subsequently pleaded guilty on April 23, 2010, to his participation in a scheme to embezzle funds from the Mailers Union, from the time he was appointed to manage the union until his resignation in September 2009.

In his plea allocution, DeANGELIS, 52, of Franklin Square, New York, admitted embezzling thousands of dollars from the Mailers Union while serving as the temporary administrator by cashing thousands of dollars in checks written by DeANGELIS to himself without authorization, and fraudulently obtaining reimbursement for expenses that he did not, in fact, incur.

Judge BERMAN also sentenced DeANGELIS to three years of supervised release.

Mr. BHARARA praised the work of the U.S. Department of Labor's Office of Labor-Management Standards.

This case is being prosecuted by the Office's Public Corruption Unit. Assistant United States Attorney RUA M. KELLY is in charge of the prosecution.
