BRIGHTON MAN IS SENTENCED IN CHILD PORNOGRAPHY CASE

ROCHESTER, N.Y.-- U.S. Attorney William J. Hochul, Jr. announced today that Mohamad Nazir Ahmad, 59, of Brighton, N.Y., who was convicted of child pornography, was sentenced to 36 months in prison by U.S. District Judge David G. Larimer. Judge Larimer ordered that the 36 month sentence be served consecutively to a five year state sentence the defendant is currently serving for a conviction for criminal sexual act. The judge further ordered that Ahmad be placed on supervised release for 10 years, which is to be served concurrently with the 5 years of post release supervision imposed by state court.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Tiffany H. Lee, who handled the case, stated that the defendant possessed a camera with a memory stick containing three videos he produced depicting himself engaging in sexually explicit conduct with a 13-year-old female. Ahmad was convicted in Monroe County Court for criminal sexual act based on the sexual conduct with the 13-year-old victim.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by United States Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims. The sentencing is the culmination of an investigation on the part of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, under the direction of Christopher M. Piehota, Special Agent in

Charge, the Brighton Police Department, under the direction of Chief Mark Henderson,

Attorney Sandra Doorley.
