## **ROCHESTER MAN SENTENCED FOR FAILURE TO APPEAR FOR SENTENCE**

ROCHESTER, N.Y.-- U.S. Attorney William J. Hochul, Jr. announced today that Christopher Rondeau, 68, formerly of Rochester, N.Y., who was convicted of failure to appear for sentence, was sentenced to 14 months in prison by U.S. District Judge David G. Larimer. The sentence will be served consecutively to the underlying 42 month sentence the defendant received in 2009 for which he failed to appear to serve.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Tiffany H. Lee, who handled the case, stated that on February 22, 1990, the defendant was sentenced to 42 months in prison by Judge Larimer and ordered to voluntarily surrender himself to a designated Bureau of Prison facility. Rondeau was notified to report to the Allenwood, PA Bureau of Prison facility on March 28, 1990. The defendant failed to appear at the facility. In March 2011, Rondeau finally turned himself in to the FBI in Louisiana.

The sentencing is the culmination of an investigation on the part of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, under the direction of Christopher M. Piehota, Special Agent in Charge.
