INDICTMENT

COUNT ONE

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

On or about January 9, 2002, in Reading, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania,
and elsewhere, defendant

FRANCISCO PAEZ-JIMENEZ,
a/k/a Edwin Roman-Morales,

an alien and a native and citizen of the Dominican Republic, knowingly and willfully made false statements in an application for a United States passport, with intent to induce and secure for his own use, the issuance of a passport under the authority of the United States, contrary to the laws regulating the issuance of passports and the rules prescribed pursuant to such laws, that is, defendant FRANCISCO PAEZ-JIMENEZ stated that his name was “Edwin Roman-Morales,” that he was born in Puerto Rico, and was, therefore, a United States citizen, and that his Social Security Number ended with the last four digits 4796, which statements he knew to be false.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1542.
