**INDICTMENT**

**COUNT ONE**

**THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:**

On or about July 27, 2006, in Feasterville, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania,  
defendant

**DAVID IVINS**

knowingly possessed a computer hard drive, CDs and DVDs, which contained more than 600  
visual depictions that had been produced using materials that had been mailed, shipped, and  
transported in interstate and foreign commerce. The production of these visual depictions  
involved the use of minors engaging in sexually explicit conduct and the visual depictions were  
of minors engaging in sexually explicit conduct.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252(a)(4)(B).

**NOTICE OF FORFEITURE**

**THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:**

As a result of the violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252(a)(4), set forth in this indictment, defendant

**DAVID IVINS**

shall forfeit to the United States of America any property used or intended to be used, in any manner or part, to commit, or to facilitate the commission of, the violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2252(a)(4), as charged in this indictment, including, but not limited to:

1. one HP Vectra computer, model VL 420 SF, serial number US22704311, containing one hard disk drive, a Maxtor model D740X-6L, serial number 662215245626;
2. 20 CD-Rs, 700 MB each, from various manufacturers; and
3. 99 DVDs, 4.4 GB each, from various manufacturers.

All pursuant to Title 18, United States Code, Section 2253.
