INDICTMENT

COUNT ONE

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

- 1. Kang's Mini Market, located at 5101 Wayne Avenue in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, was a business engaged in interstate commerce.
- 2. On or about January 5, 2010, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce, and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, by robbery, in that, defendant BRUNSON unlawfully took and obtained cash from the Kang's Mini Market located at 5101 Wayne Avenue, in Philadelphia, in the presence of employees of the Kang's Mini Market and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Kang's Mini

Market, by pointing a firearm at, demanding money from, and otherwise threatening them.

COUNT TWO

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

On or about January 5, 2010, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

knowingly used and carried a firearm, that is, a handgun, black in color, during and in relation to a crime of violence for which he may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interfered with interstate commerce, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(a).

COUNT THREE

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

- 1. Ed's Pizza House, located at 5022 Wayne Avenue in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, was a business engaged in interstate commerce.
- 2. On or about February 21, 2010, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce, and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, by robbery, in that, defendant BRUNSON unlawfully took and obtained cash from the Ed's Pizza House, located at 5022 Wayne Avenue, in Philadelphia, in the presence of employees of Ed's Pizza House and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Ed's Pizza House, by pointing a firearm at, demanding money from, and otherwise threatening them.

COUNT FOUR

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

On or about February 21, 2010, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

knowingly used and carried a firearm, that is, a loaded Ruger 9mm semi-automatic pistol, model P95, serial number 316-93431, black in color, and 11 rounds of ammunition, during and in relation to a crime of violence for which he may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interfered with interstate commerce, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(a).

COUNT FIVE

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

- 1. Paragraph 1 of Count Three of this indictment is incorporated here.
- 2. On or about February 22, 2010, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce, and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, by robbery, in that, defendant BRUNSON unlawfully took and obtained cash from the Ed's Pizza House, located at 5022 Wayne Avenue, in Philadelphia, in the presence of employees of Ed's Pizza House and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Ed's Pizza House, by pointing a firearm at, demanding money from, and otherwise threatening them.

COUNT SIX

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

On or about February 22, 2010, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

knowingly used and carried a firearm, that is, a loaded Ruger 9mm semi-automatic pistol, model P95, serial number 316-93431, black in color, and 11 rounds of ammunition, during and in relation to a crime of violence for which he may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interfered with interstate commerce, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(a).

COUNT SEVEN

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

At all times material to this indictment:

- 1. Paragraph 1 of Count Three of this indictment is incorporated here.
- 2. On or about February 23, 2010, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce, and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, by robbery, in that, defendant BRUNSON unlawfully took and obtained cash from the Ed's Pizza House, located at 5022 Wayne Avenue, in Philadelphia, in the presence of employees of Ed's Pizza House and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees of Ed's Pizza House, by pointing a firearm at, demanding money from, and otherwise threatening them.

COUNT EIGHT

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

On or about February 23, 2010, in Philadelphia, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

knowingly used and carried a firearm, that is, a loaded Ruger 9mm semi-automatic pistol, model P95, serial number 316-93431, black in color, and 11 rounds of ammunition, during and in relation to a crime of violence for which he may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interfered with interstate commerce, in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 1951(a).

NOTICE OF FORFEITURE

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

As a result of the violations of Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(c), set forth in this indictment, defendant

BRANDON BRUNSON

shall forfeit to the United States of America, the firearm involved in the commission of these offenses, including, but not limited to:

(1) a Ruger 9mm semi-automatic pistol, model P95, serial number 316-93431, black in color, and 11 rounds of ammunition.

All pursuant to Title 28, United States Code, Section 2461(c) and Title 18, United States Code, Section 924(d).
