## **NEWS RELEASE**

Diane Donnelly was indicted¹ today on drug charges that include one count of distribution of a controlled substance, one count of distribution of a controlled substance within 1,000 feet of an elementary school, one count of possession with intent to distribute controlled substances, and one count of possession with intent to distribute controlled substances within 1,000 feet of a school, announced United States Attorney Zane David Memeger. The indictment charges that on January 25, 2011, the defendant distributed approximately 16 tablets of Xanax within 1,000 feet of the Henry A. Brown Elementary School in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and that on January 26, 2011, the defendant possessed with the intent to distribute various controlled substances, including Amphetamine, Methylphenidate, Oxycodone, Methamphetamine, Morphine, Opium, Valium and Xanax, also within 1,000 feet of the Henry A. Brown Elementary School.

If convicted, the defendant faces a maximum sentence of 75 years in prison, a mandatory minimum six years up to lifetime supervised release, a \$3,750,000 fine, and a \$400 special assessment.

The case was investigated by agents from the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Drug Enforcement Administration, and the Philadelphia Police Department, and is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Thomas M. Zaleski.
