## **ARMY INVESTIGATOR INDICTED FOR RECEIPT AND POSSESSION CHILD PORNOGRAPHY**

In El Paso, 33-year-old Jeremy Drews, a U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Division Special Agent assigned to Fort Bliss, remains in federal custody after being indicted this week for receipt, possession and distribution of child pornography announced United States Attorney Robert Pitman and Acting U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement Homeland Security Investigations Special Agent in Charge Dennis Ulrich.

The three-count indictment charges Drews with one count each of receipt, possession and distribution of child pornography. Last month, federal authorities arrested Drews following the execution of a search warrant at his residence. During the search, investigators seized Drews' home computer and related media. A preliminary forensics analysis of the seized items revealed the presence of child pornography downloaded via the Internet.

Upon conviction, Drews faces between 5 and 20 years in federal prison for receipt of child porn; between 5 and 20 years in federal prison for distribution of child porn; and, up to ten years in federal prison for possession of child porn.

This case was investigated by agents with Immigration and Customs Enforcement - Homeland Security Investigations (ICE-HSI) in El Paso. Assistant United States Attorney Daniel Crumby is prosecuting this case on behalf of the Government.

**An indictment is merely a charge and should not be considered as evidence of guilt. The defendant is presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.**
