## MIDDLETON MAN SENTENCED TO FEDERAL PRISON FOR DISTRIBUTING HEROIN

Madison, Wis. - Stephen P. Sinnott, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Michael Adams, 52, Middleton, Wis., was sentenced today by U.S. District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to three years in prison for distributing heroin. Adams pleaded guilty to this charge on October 28, 2009.

Adams is the fifth of nine defendants to be sentenced in federal court after a series of arrests in August related to heroin trafficking. The remaining defendants - Walter Green, Chavis Webster, Cherish Jones, and Yarnell Fuller - are scheduled to be sentenced this month and in early February 2010. Last week, Brian Adams was sentenced to ten years in prison, Derek Farmer was sentenced to 78 months, Eric Dixon was sentenced to 27 months, and Corey Webster was sentenced to 151 months, for their respective roles in the case.

The charge against Adams was the result of an investigation conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration; Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation; Madison Police Department; Middleton Police Department; Sun Prairie Police Department; McFarland Police Department; DeForest Police Department; and Dane County Narcotics and Gang Task Force. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Jeffrey M. Anderson and Paul W. Connell.
