### FEDERAL GRAND JURY RETURNS INDICTMENTS

Madison, Wisconsin - A federal grand jury in the Western District of Wisconsin, sitting in Madison, returned the following indictments today. You are advised that a charge is merely an accusation and that a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

#### **NEKOOSA MAN CHARGED WITH COUNTERFEITING**

Darby Bennett, 36, Nekoosa, Wis., is charged with one count of making counterfeit \$100 bills, and two counts of passing counterfeit \$100 bills. The indictment alleges that he passed a counterfeit bill in Wausau, Wis., on December 27, 2009, and in Plover, Wis., on January 5, 2010.

If convicted, Bennett faces a maximum penalty of 20 years in federal prison on each count. The charges against him are the result of an investigation by the Wisconsin Rapids Police Department and the U.S. Secret Service. The prosecution of this case has been assigned to Assistant U.S. Attorney Rita M. Rumbelow.

#### **MAN CHARGED WITH ILLEGALLY REENTERING INTO UNITED STATES**

Servando Flores-Bonilla, 31, a citizen of Mexico found in Madison, Wis., is charged with illegally reentering the United States after previously being deported. The indictment alleges that he was found in the United States on July 14, 2010.

If convicted, Flores-Bonilla faces a maximum penalty of 20 years in federal prison. The charge against him is result of an investigation by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. The prosecution of this case has been assigned to Assistant U.S. Attorney Robert A. Anderson.
