**MADISON MAN SENTENCED TO FIVE YEARS  
FOR SELLING CRACK COCAINE**

Madison, Wis. - Stephen P. Sinnott, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Terrance McCauley, 23, Madison, Wis., was sentenced on Friday, May 28, by U.S. District Judge Barbara Crabb to five years in prison without parole for selling crack cocaine and possessing crack cocaine with the intent to distribute it. McCauley pleaded guilty to these charges on February 4, 2010.

On May 29, 2008, McCauley sold crack cocaine to an undercover officer. On September 12, 2008, officers contacted McCauley to investigate an assault. The victim reported being beaten with a baseball bat. During the course of that investigation, officers discovered approximately seventeen grams of crack in McCauley's pocket. His sentence was increased because Judge Crabb determined that McCauley participated in the beating.

The charges against McCauley were the result of an investigation conducted by the Dane County Narcotics and Gang Task Force and Drug Enforcement Administration. McCauley is the eleventh defendant sentenced as part of this investigation. The other sentences have ranged from five months to 180 months. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Elizabeth Altman.
