**MILWAUKEE MAN SENTENCED
FOR DISTRIBUTING CRACK COCAINE**

Madison, Wis. - John W. Vaudreuil, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Shumond M. Long, 26, of Milwaukee, Wis., was sentenced today by U.S. District Judge Barbara Crabb to 84 months without parole for distributing crack cocaine. This prison term will be followed by four years of supervised release. Long pleaded guilty to this charge on July 29, 2010.

The charge against Long arose from an investigation of crack cocaine distribution in the Wisconsin Rapids area between October 2005 and November 2007. Tara Johnson, 35, Elk Mound, Wis., who worked with Long in distributing cocaine, was sentenced to 60 months in prison by Judge Crabb on March 10, 2010.

The charges against Long and Johnson were the result of an investigation conducted by the Wisconsin Rapids Police Department and Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Peter M. Jarosz.
