MADISON MAN SENTENCED FOR DISTRIBUTING COCAINE

Madison, Wis. - John W. Vaudreuil, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Javier Cabrera, 30, Madison, Wis., was sentenced today by U.S. District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to five years in prison for distributing 749 grams of cocaine. Pursuant to federal law, the sentence will be served without the possibility of parole.

Cabrera's co-defendant, Victor DeSantiago-Tinoco, 31, Queretaro, Mexico, was sentenced on August 3, 2010, by Judge Crabb to 37 months in prison for his role in the cocaine distribution. DeSantiago-Tinoco will be deported after he completes his sentence.

United States Attorney Vaudreuil stated that the charges followed an investigation conducted by the Dane County Narcotics and Gang Task Force, Drug Enforcement Administration, and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. Prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Timothy M. O'Shea.
