## MADISON MAN SENTENCED TO 15 YEARS FOR ARMED ROBBERY

Madison, Wis. - John W. Vaudreuil, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Berry Carr, 22, Madison, Wis., was sentenced yesterday by U.S. District Judge William M. Conley to 15 years in prison, without the possibility of parole, for the robbery of a Stop N' Go and brandishing a firearm during that robbery. Carr's sentence will be followed by a three-year term of supervised release. Carr pleaded guilty to these charges on July 17, 2010.

Carr robbed the Stop N' Go at 2932 Fish Hatchery Road, Fitchburg, Wis., on December 26, 2009, when no other customers were in the store. Surveillance video proved that Carr approached the counter, removed a silver handgun from a pocket and pointed it in the direction of the clerk, demanding money.

Carr had moved to Madison from Chicago a few months prior to the robbery. His 15-year sentence reflects the fact that he has three drug felony convictions from Chicago.

The charges against Carr were the result of an investigation conducted by the Madison Police Department, Fitchburg Police Department, and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Rita M. Rumbelow.
