MONONA MAN SENTENCED TO FOUR YEARS FOR SELLING CRACK COCAINE

Madison, Wis. - John W. Vaudreuil, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Adam D. Fletcher, 28, Monona, Wis., was sentenced today by U.S. District Judge William M. Conley to 48 months in prison without parole for selling crack cocaine to an undercover police officer. This prison term is to be followed by three years of supervised release. Fletcher pleaded guilty to this charge on February 22, 2011.

Fletcher sold crack cocaine to an undercover officer on four separate occasions. While the amount of crack sold was not large, Fletcher's extensive criminal history increased his sentence. Additionally, Fletcher was on probation at the time of one of the deliveries. In sentencing Fletcher, Judge Conley expressed concern about Fletcher's history of being involved in violent crimes, including an offense where a victim sustained a skull fracture.

The charges against Fletcher were the result of an investigation conducted by the Dane County Narcotics and Gang Task Force and Drug Enforcement Administration. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorney Elizabeth Altman.
