MERRILL MAN SENTENCED ON METHAMPHETAMINE CHARGE

Hal D. "Casey" Mulford is Eighth Person Sentenced in Federal Court for Manufacturing Methamphetamine in Lincoln County

Madison, Wis. - John W. Vaudreuil, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Hal D. "Casey" Mulford, 27, Merrill, Wis., was sentenced yesterday by Chief U.S. District Judge William M. Conley to 42 months in prison, to be followed by a three-year period of supervised release, for conspiring to possess pseudoephedrine with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine from March 2009 to January 2010. Mulford was also ordered to pay \$3,376 in restitution for clean up costs of toxic methamphetamine manufacture materials.

Mulford's co-conspirator Christopher Schmeltzer is scheduled for sentencing later this month. Schmeltzer faces a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison. Federal prison sentences are served without the possibility of parole.

The prosecution of Mulford was the result of an extensive and ongoing investigation conducted by the Merrill Police Department, Lincoln County Sheriff's Department, and Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation. To date, the cooperative state, local and federal investigation has resulted in the conviction of nine people involved in five separate methamphetamine cooking operations during 2009. Set forth below are the defendants who have previously been convicted and sentenced in federal court:
