KENYAN NATIONALS TO BE SENTENCED FOR ROLES IN INTERNATIONAL MULTI-MILLION DOLLAR FRAUD SCHEME

United States Attorney Booth Goodwin To Hold Press Conference

CHARLESTON, W. Va. – Three Kenyan nationals will be sentenced tomorrow for their roles in an international scheme that defrauded the State of West Virginia and several other states of more than \$3.3 million. The scheme used dummy companies whose names mimicked those of companies doing work for the state—for example, "Deloite Consulting" instead of the legitimate Deloitte Consulting and "Unisyss Corporation" in place of Unisys Corporation. The fraudsters then deceived state financial officials into sending payments to the similarly named dummy corporations instead of the legitimate state vendors. After the money was diverted, much of it was quickly transferred offshore to bank accounts in the defendants' native Kenya, beyond ready reach of authorities.
