**TWO PLEAD GUILTY TO FEDERAL DRUG CHARGES**

BECKLEY, W. Va. – Chance Evans, 30, of Bluefield, Virginia, pleaded guilty today before United States District Judge Irene C. Berger to using a telephone to facilitate a drug deal. Evans faces up to 4 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine when he is sentenced on March 2, 2011. On April 29, 2010, Evans used a telephone to communicate with another individual to arrange the distribution of five 80 mg oxycodone pills at Wolfe, Mercer County. The West Virginia State Police, Bureau of Criminal Investigations and the Southern Regional Drug and Violent Crime Task Force conducted the investigation. Assistant United States Attorney John L. File is handling the prosecution.

Chrystal Gale Cadle, 33, of Amigo, West Virginia, pleaded guilty yesterday before Judge Berger to conspiracy to distribute oxycodone. An investigation conducted by the West Virginia State Police revealed that Cadle and others engaged in a plan to sell oxycodone pills between October 2008 and October 21, 2009, in Amigo, Wyoming County, West Virginia. At her hearing, Cadle admitted that the drug ring sold between \$33,000 and \$50,000 worth of oxycodone pills during the conspiracy. Cadle, who is scheduled to be sentenced on March 17, 2011, faces up to 20 years in prison and a \$1 million fine. Assistant United States Attorney John L. File is handling the prosecution.
