**Department of Justice Report regarding
No-Knock Entries between
October 2021 and March 2023**



**Annual Report to the President of No-Knock Entries
by Department of Justice Law Enforcement Components**

This report responds to section 10(c) of Executive Order 14074, which calls for the heads of Federal law enforcement agencies to issue annual reports to the President – and to post those reports publicly – setting forth the number of no-knock entries that occurred pursuant to judicial authorization; the number of no-knock entries that occurred pursuant to exigent circumstances; and disaggregated data by circumstances for no-knock entries in which a law enforcement officer or other person was injured in the course of a no-knock entry.

The table below sets forth the number of instances where DOJ law enforcement personnel executed a court authorized a no-knock entry and the number of instances where DOJ law enforcement personnel executed a no-knock entry pursuant to exigent circumstances for the period beginning in the first fiscal quarter of 2022 (October – December 2021) through the end of the second fiscal quarter of 2023 (January – March 2023). Over the covered time period, there have been no circumstances in which a law enforcement officer or other person was injured in the course of a no-knock entry.
