Fact Sheet

Under a settlement with the Department of Justice and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the Puerto Rico Aqueduct and Sewer Authority (PRASA) has agreed to invest in major upgrades, inspections and cleaning of facilities within the Puerto Nuevo system and continue improvements to its systems Island-wide.

Under this agreement, PRASA will spend approximately \$1.5 billion dollars to make necessary improvements. PRASA will prioritize capital improvement projects and take into consideration the effect of each requirement on the population served.
