JUSTICE FOR FAMILIES PROGRAM





The Grants to Support Families in the Justice System Program (Justice for Families Program) improves the response of the civil and criminal justice system to families with a history of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, or in cases involving allegations of child sexual abuse.

The program supports the following activities for improving the capacity of courts and communities to respond to families affected by the targeted crimes: court-based and court-related programs; supervised visitation and safe exchange by and between parents; training for court-based and court-related personnel; and civil legal assistance. All services must be provided in a culturally relevant manner.

Grant funds can support:



Court-based and court-related programs



Supervised visitation and safe exchange by and between parents



Civil legal assistance



Training for court-based and courtrelated personnel

Eligible Applicants

Eligible applicants include: states; units of local government; courts (including juvenile courts); Indian Tribal governments; nonprofit organizations; legal service providers; and victim service providers. These organization must be located in the United States or U.S. territories.
