Submission Requirements

- Identify the crime and public safety problem(s) described in the Tribal Community and Justice Profile
 that the tribe plans to address through the proposed grant funding. Describe how this
 comprehensive justice system—wide strategic planning is expected to provide guidance on how to
 address the identified problem(s). (Please note that the DOJ encourages a victim-centered
 approach to justice. Each comprehensive justice system strategic plan should include improvements
 to your victim services and engagement.)
- 2. Describe current or previous strategic planning efforts, if any, and state whether they were effective.
- 3. Explain why justice system—wide strategic planning is a necessary step to improving community safety and wellness.
- 4. Describe the makeup of the core planning team and proposed tribal representatives who will participate in the strategic planning process by job title or position. Describe how this team will collaborate with the DOJ TTA provider to assess the justice system needs of the tribal community to develop a comprehensive justice system strategic plan.
- 5. Identify current Tribal Government and community initiatives whose leaders will be involved in the strategic planning process. Describe how these inititatives can be leveraged to complement or enhance the implementation of the comprehensive justice improvement strategic plan. Describe the roles of each identified partner.
