STIPULATION BETWEEN PARTIES IN SUPPORT OF THE UNOPPOSED MOTION OF THE MAINE LOBSTERMEN'S ASSOCIATION

TO TERMINATE THE FINAL JUDGMENT

It is stipulated by and between the undersigned parties, through their respective attorneys, that:

 Defendant Maine Lobstermen's Association, Inc. ("MLA"), the successor in interest to the Maine Lobstermen's Association ("Association"), one of the original defendants in this action,¹ has filed a motion requesting that the Court terminate the final judgment entered in the above-captioned matter on August 5, 1958 ("Final Judgment"). The United States has agreed to the termination of the Final Judgment subject to reserving its right to withdraw its consent at any time prior to the Court entering an order granting termination of the Final Judgment.

¹ Leslie Dyer, the other defendant named in the Final Judgment, was the Association's former President and is deceased.

2. In the event that the Court finds that termination of the Final Judgment is in the public interest, an Order in the form of Exhibit A may be filed and entered by the Court *sua sponte*, provided that the United States has not withdrawn its consent.

3. The United States may withdraw its consent at any time before the entry of an Order terminating the Final Judgment by filing a notice of withdrawal of its consent with the Court and serving a copy of said notice upon MLA.

4. In the event that the United States withdraws its consent, or if an Order terminating the Final Judgment is not entered pursuant to this Stipulation, then this Stipulation shall be of no effect whatsoever; the making of this Stipulation shall be without prejudice to any party in this proceeding; and the Stipulation shall not thereafter be used in this or any other action or for any other purpose.
