The United States of America charges:

- 1. From in or about April 2007 until in or about November 2007 ("the Relevant Period"), WENDEL P. TORRES ("the defendant") was employed as the Managing Partner of Company A. William T. Armstrong was employed as a public official, namely, as the Chief of the Construction Division of the Fort Carson Directorate of Contracting, an agency of the United States.
- 2. During the Relevant Period and in the District of Colorado, the defendant directly or indirectly gave, offered, and promised a thing of value to a public official for or because of official acts performed by such public official; to wit, the defendant provided free home construction materials to Armstrong, for or because of official acts performed by Armstrong.

The foregoing was a violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 201(c)(1)(A).
