COMPLAINT

The United States of America, plaintiff, by its attorneys, acting under the direction of the Attorney General of the United States, brings this civil action to obtain equitable relief against the above-named defendants, and complains and alleges as follows:

Ι

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. This complaint is filed and this action is instituted against the defendants under Section 15 of the Act of Congress of October 15, 1914, as amended (15 U.S.C. § 25), commonly known as the Clayton Act, in order to prevent and restrain the continuing violation by the defendants, as hereinafter alleged, of Section 7 of the Clayton Act (15 U.S.C. § 18).

2. The defendants transact business and are found within the Central District of California.

II DEFINITIONS

3. As used herein:

"Southern California" means that area of (a) California from the Bakersfield area to the Mexican border, including Kern, Santa Barbara, San Bernardino, Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Diego and Imperial Counties; "swimming pools" means residential swimming (b) pools constructed of steel-reinforced gunite or concrete and includes the trim, equipment and accessories regularly sold with a finished swimming pool, such as, but not limited to, filtration systems, decking and tile; and "franchisee" means a business entity which is (c) licensed by a separate business entity to construct and sell swimming pools under a designated trade name on conditions and terms established by the licensor.

III

DEFENDANTS

4. KDI Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "KDI") is hereby made a defendant herein. KDI is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Delaware and maintains its principal office in Cincinnati, Ohio.

5. KDI Aqua Systems, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "KDI Aqua") is hereby made a defendant herein. KDI Aqua is a corporation existing under the laws of the State of Delaware which was organized in 1969 and maintains its principal office in North Hollywood, California. KDI Aqua is a wholly-owned subsidiary of KDI. Each reference to KDI Aqua herein shall include its subsidiary and affiliate corporations.

6. JHO Dissolution Co. (hereinafter referred to as "JHO") is hereby made a defendant herein. JHO is a corporation existing under the laws of the State of California for the purpose of winding up the affairs of Aqua Systems, Inc. Aqua Systems, Inc. was organized in 1968 and changed its name to JHO Dissolution Co. on or about January 15, 1970, after transferring substantially all of its assets to KDI Aqua. JHO maintains its principal office in Los Angeles County, California. Each reference to JHO herein shall include Aqua Systems, Inc. and the subsidiary and affiliate corporations of JHO and Aqua Systems, Inc.

IV

TRADE AND COMMERCE

7. Prior to the sale of its assets to KDI, JHO licensed various franchisees to sell and install swimming pools in Southern California under the trade names "Blue Haven Pools" and "Sunset Pools". JHO either owned a controlling stock interest in or exercised control over the business operations of its franchisees through franchise agreements.

8. Royal Pools of Orange County (hereinafter referred to as "Royal") is a corporation existing under the laws of the State of California which was organized in 1960 and maintains its principal office in North Hollywood, California. Royal has licensed various franchisees to sell and install swimming pools in Southern California under the trade name "Royal Pools". Royal has owned a controlling stock interest in each of its franchisees.

9. In 1969, approximately 11,000 swimming pools were installed in Southern California. The total value of such swimming pools was over \$40 million. Approximately 22 percent of the swimming pools installed in Southern California in 1969 were sold by franchisees of JHO under the Blue Haven Pools or Sunset Pools trade names. Royal franchisees operating under the Royal Pools trade name accounted for an additional 9 percent of such sales.

Prior to sale of its assets to KDI, JHO was engaged in 10. the sale and installation of swimming pools and in the licensing of franchisees to sell and install swimming pools in various states of the United States.

Both JHO and Royal, including their subsidiaries and 11. affiliates, have ordered, purchased and received, and have caused to be ordered, purchased and received, substantial quantities of swimming pool equipment and accessories and materials and supplies used in the construction and installation of swimming pools which have been shipped and transported across state lines in interstate and foreign commerce, and have acted as conduits for the regular, continuous and uninterrupted flow of such equipment, accessories. materials and supplies through their warehouses and facilities to purchasers of swimming pools in Southern California.

V

OFFENSE ALLEGED

12. On or about July 10, 1969, JHO acquired substantially all of the outstanding capital stock of Royal. On or about January 9, 1970, at the direction of KDI, KDI Aqua acquired substantially all of the assets of JHO.

13. The effect of the transactions described in paragraph 22 12 has been to create and perpetuate a consolidation of business operations which may substantially lessen competition or tend to create a monopoly in the sale of swimming pools in Southern 24 California, in violation of Section 7 of the Clayton Act, in the following ways, among others:

> actual and potential competition between (a) franchisees selling under the Blue Haven Pools and Sunset Pools trade names and franchisees selling under the Royal Pools trade name has been substantially lessened;

(b) the relative size of KDI Aqua's swimming pool sales and installation operations in Southern California has been increased to such a point that its advantage over competitors threatens to become decisive; and

(c) concentration in the sale of swimming pools in Southern California has been increased to the detriment of actual and potential competition.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, the plaintiff prays:

1. That the transactions described in paragraph 12 of this complaint be adjudged a violation of Section 7 of the Clayton Act.

2. That KDI Aqua be required to divest all of its ownership interest in Royal.

3. That KDI and KDI Aqua be enjoined for a period of 10 years from the date of final judgment in this action from acquiring, directly or indirectly, the stock or assets of any corporation, company or business engaged in the sale or installation of swimming pools in Southern California.

4. That the plaintiff have such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require and which the Court may deem just and proper.
