
# **AOL Web Browser**

Usability Test - December 1997

#### **Executive Summary**

It is impossible to give a general overview of the public's perception of AOL's Web Browser without distinguishing between the three main categories of AOL users. The first and clearly most interesting group of users is the Novice. The most alarming fact discovered in the Novice group is that most do not know the difference between being on AOL and being on the Internet. Those Novice users thought that once they signed on to AOL, they had already accessed the Internet. Sometimes even mistaking AOL channels for actual web sites. It's evident that the Novice user will sign on to AOL, browse through three AOL channels (never actually visiting the World Wide Web) and think they have just visited three different web sites.

In the Novice experience curiosity often wins over impatience. Once a Novice finds a web site, they're dazzled by the graphics and colors. They are content to wait longer than an Intermediate or Advanced user will wait for a page to load. Because it took them so long to get there, they assume it must be something worthwhile.

The next obstacle the Novice user faces is differentiating between AOL's search engine and AOL's Browser. Most think that AOL NetFind and the Browser do the same thing. If a Novice user were to stumble on to AOL NetFind, there is confusion about whether they are just searching for web site, or actually using the Browser to visit a web site. When given an Internet address, some Novices will try searching from AOL NetFind or AOL.com, not recognizing that they are able to simply type in the url. Although most Novices realize that NetFind is a tool used to search, they don't understand what a Browser is, or does. Another factor here is that AOL.com is not intuitive enough for the average Novice to use. Some users even go through screens in circles before finding a hyperlink to a web site, causing frustration not only in Novices, but also in Intermediate users.

As far as the Intermediate users are concerned, most of their experience is with AOL only. They are happy with AOL's Browser because they don't have enough experience with other Browsers to make comparisons. Intermediate users did not seem to blame AOL for the length of time spent waiting for a web site to load. They understood that the time of day, number of visitors, modem connection and the web site itself all determine how long it takes a site to load. Consequently, the Intermediate user usually will not wait for a page to completely appear before they find what they want within the site and go there. If the site is taking too long, in their opinion, then they will either try again at another time, or abandon that site completely.

Like the Novice users, over half of the Intermediate users could not distinguish between AOL NetFind and AOL's Browser. They thought of them as the same. Although Intermediates basically knew the difference between a search engine and a Browser, they did not realize AOL NetFind functions differently than AOL's Browser. Going through two or three screens is how an Intermediate user accesses a web site. This accounts for the comparisons Intermediate users made between other search engines, like Yahoo, and AOL's Browser.

Advanced users have used other Browsers, as well as AOL's Browser. They feel that improvements have been made in AOL's Browser, and use it interchangeably with other Browsers. They understand every aspect of why a web site may take longer to load. Advanced users' complaints center around what AOL's Browser allows you to see, once a web site is loaded, such as graphics and colors.

However, there is still confusion between AOL's Browser and AOL NetFind. Internet Explorer is not made obvious as AOL's Browser. Advanced users may use Internet Explorer at work and feel that it's faster than when they use AOL at home, not realizing that they're using the same Browser. Advanced users clearly know the difference between search engines and Browers, but some didn't see the differences between AOL's Browser and AOL NetFind. Advanced users also felt that AOL.com was not intuitive, causing them to spend more time there instead of going directly to a site through another Browser.

- Lenjoy using AOL.







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- In general, I evaluate the topic I am trying to find before choosing the browser. When I'm looking for something really obscure, I use Alta Vista or Excite, but when I am looking for basic topics, I'll use Yahoo or AOL.
- I hope the information superhighway goes under a major reconstruction. Right now, it causes too much confusion and major traffic jams.
- There are still many issues AOL needs to deal with before they really worry about their browser.
- It would be very nice if you could give us either an additional local access number or at least increase the amount of possible connections available with the two current numbers. It is ridiculous that both number are often busy from 4 pm to midnight, but I can call Baltimore and sign on with the first try.
- Make the browser look more like Explorer. Give the browser all the functions of the real version of Explorer.
- Good tool. Only complaint is initial window size and the fact that the AOL site windows stay open in the background. They should close automatically when you transition to the Internet. Then when you want to return to AOL there should be a hot button to reopen the regular AOL windows.
