Key Features:

- 1) Turnkey sign-up with an ISP like MCI, Sprint, PSI, or Netcom We will select a single ISP with an already working automatic signup protocol who has at least widespread US coverage, and hopefully some internation coverage.
- 2) Web, FTP, Gopher browser, shell-integrated (modulo schedule constraints) with responsiveness/performance on par with Netscape -- good news is that Spyglass code is pretty close.
- 3) Mail & News via Capone + Route 66

Potential Issues:

- 1) Won't use MSN IP/UUNET
- ==> They won't be ready, and, besides, this is the backup plan.
- 2) Won't use Catapult DLLs
- ==> We ship before NT Internet Server, and this reduces our testing hit as well as dependencies -- we just use the Spyglass protocol code.
- 3) Won't do sim-ship DBCS
- ==> This is a fair bit of work, we already have to spend time moving strings to enable SBCS localization, and the Asian consumer market to Internet access is assumed to be small.
- 4) Probably won't have full Win95 country coverage for ISP
- ==> We're unlike to find an ISP who has points of presence in every country that we ship Frosting.

Rationale:

- 1) MSN IP will ship at best 9/95, but could be as late as 3-6/96.
- 2) If MSN IP is late, and MS doesn't capture Internet client marketshare, then we have the worst of all cases, we don't own the client *and* we don't own the service.
- 3) OS/2 Warp 3.0 has Internet support; we need O'Hare to match up.
- 4) Internet Client would make Frosting more attractive, and so we would sell more Frosting.
- 5) Even if MSN IP does ship 9/95, O'Hare gives customers a choice between MS and non-MS Internet service.

Schedule Overview:

4/15/95 Beta 1 (ericst will have the Frosting date next week, may be sooner) 6/15/95 RTM

We've got our Install Wizard (with the exception of auto-signup) more than half-way done already (thanks to jeremys), and the Spyglass code is in



MS98 0105322 CONFIDENTIAL pretty good shape. So, as long as we can find a suitable ISP, all we have to is work hard, minimize our changes to Mosaic, and we should be able to hit our dates.

I know this isn't exactly what we agreed to in the MSN IP billg review, but I think if we're going to have a credible "backup plan", this is the only way to do it.
