The noise level from other OEMs can only get louder.

My recommendation is that a letter (crafted by Kurt's group/Pete Peter) be sent to all DTOS OEM underscores MS commitment to Windows Experience (not just the ISP element). This letter shou our willingness to work cooperatively in developing better solutions that enhance the PC experie end users. At the same time we need to get some PR from GW and PB that states that they have cooperatively with MS - this will encourage others to work with us rather than against us in the a Windows Experience.
