4. Indigo/Dome, Ireland

As above.

There are a number of other examples which I could cite, however, these should indicate that we are seeing this type of predatory behaviour in all countries with all major service providers. Similar activity in the corporate market place is beginning to occur, however, corporates are much more wery of the 'free' approach.
