Installing the BonusPak

You can install the BonusPak from diskettes or from a CD-ROM. Use the BonusPak Installation Utility if you want to install all the applications included in the BonusPak. You can use the BonusPak Installation Utility to install individual applications, as well. If you prefer, you car, install individual applications using the installation or setup program associated with the application.

Installing the BooksPak from Diskette

The following procedures assume that you are starting the Installation program from drive A. If you are starting from another diskette drive, substitute the letter of that drive.

To use the BonusPak Installation Utility program:

- 1. Insert the Ponus Pak Installation Utility Diskette into drive A.
- 2. Open OS/2 System.
- 3. Open Command Prompts.
- 4. Open either OS/2 Full Screen or OS/2 Window.
- 5. Type A:INSTALL and press Enter.
- 6. Select products to install using mouse button 1.
- 7. Select the INSTALL pushbutton.
- 8. Follow the instructions on your screen.

To install individual applications, you need to know the name of the installation program and the diskette on which the application is located. Use the following table:

- Insert the diskette that contains the application you want to install into drive
 A. Insert diskette I for an application that is on multiple diskettes.
- 2. Open OS/2 System.
- 3. Open Command Prompts.
- 4. Open either OS/2 Full Screen or OS/2 Window.
- 5. Type the command for the installation or setup program. (For example, you would type A:SETUP to install the CompuServe application.) Then press Enter.
- 6. Follow the instructions on your screen.

- 7. Type INSTALL and press Enter.
- 8. Select the applications you want to install.
- 9. Select the INSTALL pushbutton.
