Subject: Quick perspective on Chrome+Agents

Hey Demis, Koray, Chandu, and Kareem,

Thanks for the share-out earlier this week, and I wanted to offer a quick share-out of how we're thinking about Chrome+Agents:

- We see an exciting opportunity for Agents to help with repetitive, tedious, and cross-app tasks in the browser and on the web, including:
 - Interacting with or synthesizing info across many web sites/apps
 - Automating repetitive actions or workflows across many sites/apps
 - Filling in long/multi-step forms to transact on the web.
- We envision a future of multiple Agents, where Chrome integrates deeply with Gemini (as primary Agent and one we'll prioritize) *and* enables users to engage with multiple 3P Agents on the web in both consumer and enterprise settings.
- Chrome has a lot of strengths relevant to Agents:
 - Already acts as web "user agent" for billions across consumer and enterprise. (Unsurprisingly, our scale also presents challenges.)
 - Access to user's personal/web browsing data/history can help inform Agent planning, decision-making, and memory.
 - Opportunity to shape Agents on the web in an open, ecosystem-friendly way
- We're prototyping agentic experiences with you/GDM ([REDACTED]@ is a great partner), AIPEX, and Core Labs to build and train models that enable Agents to help with repetitive, tedious, and cross app tasks in the browser and on the web.
- There are many non-trivial research/product challenges we need to overcome to make Agents in Chrome a reality at scale, including [REDACTED]
