Commissioner Jones:

The API Council firmly believes that this acquisition will benefit the many communities CVS has a foothold in and we feel it is a step in the right direction in terms of bringing more health resources to many areas of California. As a non-profit organization that put the community's interest first, we support the CVS-Aetna acquisition.

The growing trend of chronic diseases impacting many Americans nationwide and especially in California, is showing the healthcare needs in the country are changing. Fifty percent of Americans now live with a chronic disease and the costs associated with those diseases account for 80 percent of overall health care costs. In California alone, a 2015 <u>study</u> published in the Journal of Public Health Management and Practice found that an estimated 39% of Californians suffer from at least one chronic condition or disease, which cost an estimated \$98 billion to treat.
