

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1 This matter came before the Court at a status conference held on February 6, 2004. In
2 light of the considerable progress that has been made in opening the American Samoa
3 petroleum market to competition, it is hereby ordered that:

- 4 (1) The Amended Court Plan for sharing storage facilities in American Samoa,
5 approved March 17, 2000, be vacated;
- 6
- 7 (2) The Final Judgment in this case is hereby modified by eliminating the requirement
8 that the Court maintain a plan for sharing petroleum storage facilities in American
9 Samoa; and
- 10 (3) The American Samoa Government shall continue to report to the United States
11 Department of Justice: (i) any apparent violation of the Final Judgment or the
12 antitrust laws with respect to the American Samoa petroleum market; (ii) any
13 change in the Terminal Operator or in its responsibilities or duties at the American
14 Samoa petroleum storage facilities; (iii) any entry to or exit from the American
15 Samoa market by a petroleum supplier; and (iv) any substantive change in the
16 Permit and Agreement or in an Operating Agreement with a supplier that
17 affects operations at the American Samoa petroleum storage facilities.
