As explained in the accompanying Memorandum in Support of the Motion of the United States of America to Terminate Legacy Antitrust Judgments, the United States has concluded that because of their age and changed circumstances since their entry, these decades-old judgments no longer serve to protect competition. The United States gave the public notice and the opportunity to comment on its intent to seek termination of the judgments in the above-captioned cases; it received no comments opposing termination.


