SUMMARY OF REASONS FOR TERMINATING EACH JUDGMENT

Case No.: 67-520

Case Name: United States v. Sonoco Products Co.

Year Judgment Entered: 1970

Section of Judgment Retaining Jurisdiction: X

Description of Judgment: The judgment required Sonoco (1) for a period of five years, to sell cone board to any person on reasonable terms; and (2) to divest certain cone making equipment; this Court vacated this provision in an order dated May 22, 1973. The judgment also enjoined Sonoco from various anticompetitive activities in the manufacture and sale of cone boards, cones, and cone-making machinery.

Reasons Judgment Should Be Terminated:

- Judgment more than ten years old.
- Core terms of the judgment have been satisfied.
- Terms of judgment prohibit acts already prohibited by law.

Case Name: United States v. Bankers Trust of South Carolina, et al.

Year Judgment Entered: 1973

Section of Judgment Retaining Jurisdiction: VI

Description of Judgment: Defendant enjoined for ten years from acquiring the assets of any commercial bank in the South Carolina counties set forth in Section IV of the judgment.

Reasons Judgment Should Be Terminated:

- Judgment more than ten years old.
- The terms of the judgment have been satisfied.
