<u>Description of Judgment</u>: The defendants, a group of paper and office supply dealers, were, with limited exception, prohibited from entering into agreements or understandings involving price fixing practices or policing of such agreements, boycotts, refusal to deal, or exclusive dealing, and from selling below cost.

Reasons Judgment Should Be Terminated:

- Judgment more than ten years old.
- Judgment terms largely prohibit acts the antitrust laws already prohibit (price fixing).
