**Sherman Act**

**Department of Justice Enforcement—Vacation of Consent Decree—Uncertain Terms and Expired Patents.**—An antitrust consent decree against three manufacturers of stamped metal wheels was vacated. The government explained that there was uncertainty over the meaning and effect of certain provisions of the judgment and that the patents subject to the decree had expired.
