The United States Attorney charges:

COUNT 1

(Theft of Medical Products-Conspiracy)

Beginning on or about January 1, 2015, and continuing to on or about December 31, 2019, in the Western District of Kentucky, Larue County, Kentucky, and elsewhere, the defendants **ASHLEY RAMSEY-WILMOTH** and **STEPHEN TROY WILMOTH** and others, known and unknown to the Grand Jury, did knowingly and unlawfully conspire to take, carry away, and conceal and knowingly possess, transport and traffic a pre-retail medical product with a value over \$5000, using a means and facility of interstate commerce, to wit: **ASHLEY RAMSEY-WILMOTH**, an employee of Century Medicines, a retail pharmacy in the supply chain for Hydrocodone and Oxycodone, took, carried away and concealed unopened bottles of Oxycodone and Hydrocodone from Century Medicines prior to the controlled substances being made available for retail purchase by a consumer in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 670(a)(1)

and provided them to **STEPHEN TROY WILMOTH** to sell and distribute the Hydrocodone and Oxycodone in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 670(a)(3).

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 670(a)(6), (b)(1) and (c)(2).

The United States Attorney further charges:

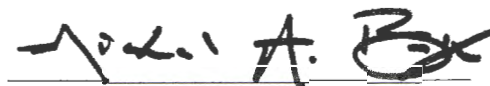
COUNT 2
(Conspiracy to Unlawfully Distribute)

Beginning on or about January 1, 2015, and continuing to on or about December 31, 2019, in the Western District of Kentucky, Larue County, Kentucky, and elsewhere, the defendants, **STEPHEN TROY WILMOTH** and **ASHLEY RAMSEY-WILMOTH**, along with unindicted co-conspirators, C.L. and others, did knowingly and intentionally combine, conspire, confederate and agree with each other and with others, to knowingly and intentionally distribute a mixture and substance containing a detectable amount of Oxycodone and Hydrocodone, Schedule II Controlled Substances.

In violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1) and 841(b)(1)(C) and 846.

NOTICE OF FORFEITURE

If convicted of any violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841 and 846, **ASHLEY RAMSEY-WILMOTH** and **STEPHEN TROY WILMOTH** the defendants, shall forfeit to the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853 any property constituting or derived from any proceeds obtained, directly or indirectly, as the result of any such violation, and any property used or intended to be used, in any manner or part, to commit or to facilitate the commission of such violation.

PENALTIES

Count 1: NM 20 yrs./\$250,000 fine/both/NM 3 yrs. Supervised Release (Ashley Ramsey-Wilmoth-see 18 U.S.C. § 670(b)(1) and (c)(2))
Count 1: NM 15 yrs./\$250,000 fine/both/NM 3 yrs. Supervised Release (Stephen Troy Wilmoth-see 18 U.S.C. § 670(c)(2))
Count 2: NM 20 yrs./\$1,000,000 fine/both/NM 3 yrs. Supervised Release
Forfeiture

NOTICE

ANY PERSON CONVICTED OF AN OFFENSE AGAINST THE UNITED STATES SHALL BE SUBJECT TO SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS, FINES, RESTITUTION & COSTS.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

18 U.S.C. § 3013 requires that a special assessment shall be imposed for each count of a conviction of offenses committed after November 11, 1984, as follows:

Misdemeanor:	\$ 25 per count/individual	Felony:	\$100 per count/individual
	\$125 per count/other		\$400 per count/other

FINES

In addition to any of the above assessments, you may also be sentenced to pay a fine. Such fine is due immediately unless the court issues an order requiring payment by a date certain or sets out an installment schedule. You shall provide the United States Attorney's Office with a current mailing address for the entire period that any part of the fine remains unpaid, or you may be held in contempt of court. 18 U.S.C. § 3571, 3572, 3611, 3612

Failure to pay fine as ordered may subject you to the following:

1. **INTEREST** and **PENALTIES** as applicable by law according to last date of offense.

For offenses occurring after December 12, 1987:

No **INTEREST** will accrue on fines under \$2,500.00.

INTEREST will accrue according to the Federal Civil Post-Judgment Interest Rate in effect at the time of sentencing. This rate changes monthly. Interest accrues from the first business day following the two week period after the date a fine is imposed.

PENALTIES of:

10% of fine balance if payment more than 30 days late.

15% of fine balance if payment more than 90 days late.

2. Recordation of a **LIEN** shall have the same force and effect as a tax lien.
3. Continuous **GARNISHMENT** may apply until your fine is paid.

18 U.S.C. §§ 3612, 3613

If you **WILLFULLY** refuse to pay your fine, you shall be subject to an **ADDITIONAL FINE** of not more than the greater of \$10,000 or twice the unpaid balance of the fine; or **IMPRISONMENT** for not more than 1 year or both. 18 U.S.C. § 3615

RESTITUTION

If you are convicted of an offense under Title 18, U.S.C., or under certain air piracy offenses, you may also be ordered to make restitution to any victim of the offense, in addition to, or in lieu of any other penalty authorized by law. 18 U.S.C. § 3663

APPEAL

If you appeal your conviction and the sentence to pay your fine is stayed pending appeal, the court shall require:

1. That you deposit the entire fine amount (or the amount due under an installment schedule during the time of your appeal) in an escrow account with the U.S. District Court Clerk, or
2. Give bond for payment thereof.

18 U.S.C. § 3572(g)
