





Your airline transportation from Assterdan to New York City has already been purchased from the Washington Office of Kalaka, and they have advised us that they are holding a reservation for you whereby you will leave Amsterdam on January 26th and arrive at the Idlevild Airport in New York City on January 27th. Since you are familiar with travel between New York and Washington by wirthe of your earlier visit, I am not arranging to have anyone meet you at the airport unless you write me that you would prefer otherwise. I saggest that you purchase your own ticket from New York City to Washington, either by airline or railroad as you prefer, and you will be compensated for the cost following your arrival in Washington.

Today I received a long latter from in which he requested authority to come to the United States by boat. I was able, although with much difficulty, to make the necessary arrangements to permit him to do this and I understand that he will leave Rotterdam en January 22 and his boat is expected to dock in New York City on January 29. I surely hope that you will not be impelled to change your plans and desire to come by boat, also, since the time is now so short I doubt that I would be able to make such arrangements surely and, therefore, I am expecting that you will come by K.L.M. on the 25th of January. K.L.M. has not yet notified us concerning the reservation it will make for

I know he is anxious to join you in insterded and fly over on the same plane and surely hope that this can be worked out to Records.
