AFFIDAVIT

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority personally came and appeared Thomas Staten, Special Agent for the Louisiana Department of Justice, Criminal Division, Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (hereinafter "MFCU"), Baton Rouge, Louisiana, who having been duly sworn, did depose and say that Adrian Lacour Brooks, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] a former employee at Westside Habilitation Center, did violate:

La. R. S. 14:93.3, Cruelty to Elderly and Persons with Infirmities- First Offense, one (1) count,

on or about September 14, 2025, in the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, in that she intentionally or in a criminally negligent manner abused D.J. [REDACTED], an elderly and intellectually disabled resident, while working at Westside Habilitation Center, the Adams Group Home located at 1214 Presidents Drive, in Alexandria, Louisiana 71303 in the Parish of Rapides.

On October 3, 2025, the Louisiana Department of Justice, Office of the Attorney General, Criminal Division, MFCU opened an investigation (MFCU File#59-5516) into an allegation of abuse that occurred at Westside Habilitation Center's, Adams Group Home. Adams Group Home is an intermediate care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities. Adams Group Home houses individuals with intellectual disabilities and provides 24-hour care to the individuals living in the homes. The Louisiana Medicaid Program then reimburses Westside Habilitation Center for its services.

The complaint alleged abuse of a resident of the facility, D.J., that occurred on or about September 14, 2025, involving, now former, Allied Health Professional (hereinafter "AHP"), Adrian Lacour Brooks (hereinafter Adrian Brooks). Resident D.J. is a [REDACTED] Louisiana Medicaid recipient, and a person with mental and intellectual disabilities.

Adams Group Home is equipped with video surveillance in most of the common areas of its homes. In connection with this allegation, Adams Group Home reviewed the video footage and provided a copy of the incidents to MFCU. Affiant reviewed the video footage provided by Adams Group Home of an incident involving Brooks and resident D.J. on September 14, 2025, and conducted interviews with all available witnesses to the incident. The video surveillance footage is time stamped.

On September 14, 2025, the victim, D.J., was outside of the Adams Group Home and was asked to come back inside by Direct Care Professional (hereinafter "DCP"), Ashley Brimage. D.J. did not initially cooperate, so Brimage asked AHP Adrian Brooks for assistance. Once all parties were inside the residence, a dispute happened between Brooks and D.J. in the hallway of the residence. Brooks wanted D.J. to go into her room, but D.J. refused. This portion of the incident was captured on video surveillance, however, what occurs inside of the bedroom was not captured due to the angle and location of the camera. In furthering our investigation Affiant conducted interviews with the individuals identified in the surveillance footage at the time of the incident. Upon interviewing DCP Brimage and client/resident J [REDACTED] L [REDACTED], both advised they witnessed Brooks forcefully escorting D.J. into her bedroom. Once inside the bedroom they observed Brooks push D.J. into the bedroom wall where she hit her head and fell to the floor. All parties except D.J. left the room. Brooks later returned and found D.J. in the adjacent bathroom, on the floor and unable to move. The on-duty nurse, Shelia Alford, was across the street at another group home and was called to assess D.J.'s injuries. After assessing D.J., Alford called for an ambulance and EMTs. Emergency personnel arrived and D.J. was transported to Rapides Regional Medical Center where she was treated for her injuries. D.J. was later determined to have a spinal injury that left her quadriplegic. D.J. was later transferred to Colonial Nursing Home in Marksville, LA.

On March 31, 2026, Affiant, along with assisting Special Agent Downhour, contacted Adrian Brooks for a statement. Brooks was advised of her Miranda rights per "Your Rights" form and signed the form agreeing to speak with Special Agents. Brooks denied all allegations and made conflicting statements advising agents that D.J. tripped over her feet, before finally stating, "Yes, I was a little aggressive with her cause you have to be that way with D**** but not to the point to cause harm to her. "I would never intentionally harm anyone, I love working with the mentally ill." I don't remember D**** hitting the wall when she fell."

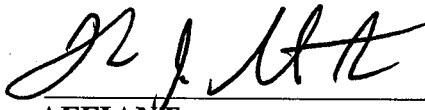
Louisiana Revised Statute 14:93.3 defines Cruelty to Elderly and Persons with Infirmitities in Subsection A as the intentional or criminally negligent mistreatment or neglect by any persons, including a caregiver, whereby unjustifiable pain, malnourishment, or suffering is caused to a person with an infirmity, an adult with a disability, or a person who is aged, including but not limited to a resident of a nursing home, facility for persons with intellectual disabilities, mental health facility, hospital or other residential facility.

Subsection B defines a "caregiver" as any person or persons who temporarily or permanently is/are responsible for the care of a person with an infirmity; an adult with a physical or mental disability; or a person who is aged, whether such care is assumed or assigned. Caregiver includes but is not limited to... daycare institutions and facilities, adult congregate living facilities and nursing homes which or who have voluntarily assumed or been assigned the care of a person who is aged, a person with an infirmity or an adult with a disability.

Thus, Affiant sets forth that there is probable cause that Adrian Lacour Brooks committed cruelty to elderly and persons with infirmitities in that she caused unjustifiable pain or suffering to D.J., an elderly person with an infirmity or intellectual disability, by

intentionally or in a criminally negligent manner forcefully shoving D.J. causing her head to hit the wall.

THEREFORE, for the above reasons, Affiant prays for the issuance of a warrant of arrest of Adrian Lacour Brooks for one (1) count of Louisiana Revised Statute 14:93.3, Cruelty to Elderly and Persons with Infirmities-First Offense.

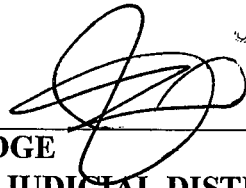
[REDACTED] did commit the crime of one (1) count of Cruelty to Elderly or Persons with Infirmities-First Offense La. R.S. 14:93.3 against D.J., a person with infirmities and who resided at Adams Group Home located at 1214 Presidents Drive, in Alexandria, Louisiana., defined by Louisiana Revised Statute 14:93.3:

Louisiana Revised Statute 14:93.3 defines Cruelty to Elderly and Persons with Infirmities in Subsection A as the intentional or criminally negligent mistreatment or neglect by any persons, including a caregiver, whereby unjustifiable pain, malnourishment, or suffering is caused to a person with an infirmity, an adult with a disability, or a person who is aged, including but not limited to a resident of a nursing home, facility for persons with intellectual disabilities, mental health facility, hospital or other residential facility.

Subsection B defines a 'caregiver' as any person or persons who temporarily or permanently is/are responsible for the care of a person with an infirmity; an adult with a physical or mental disability; or a person who is aged, whether such care is assumed or assigned. Caregiver includes but is not limited to... daycare institutions and facilities, adult congregate living facilities and nursing homes which or who have voluntarily assumed or been assigned the care of a person who is aged, a person with an infirmity or an adult with a disability.

You are, therefore, commanded forthwith to arrest the said offender and take her forth to be booked and charged in accordance with the law.
