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INFORMATION BY ATTORNEY GENERAL

BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF VERMONT, the Attorney General for the State of Vermont, upon her oath of office, charges:

COUNT 1 OF 1

MEDICAID PROVIDER FRAUD

33 V.S.A. § 141(d)

CHARGE CODE: 999

OFFENSE CLASS: F

On or about January 2025 through December 2025, in Windsor County, Vt., Brian Prouty knowingly filed claims for services to a recipient of benefits under a state or federally funded assistance program for services that were not rendered and knowingly received unauthorized payments; specifically, Brian Prouty knowingly and falsely attested that he provided care to Medicaid beneficiary Recipient A on days and times that he did not provide such care, sought payment of \$24,376 for those illusory services by submitting or causing to be submitted false timesheets to the state's contracted payroll processor in White River Junction, Vt., and received payment of \$24,376 in Vermont Medicaid funds, in violation of 33 V.S.A. § 141(d), subject to the penalties provided in 33 V.S.A. § 143(a)(3), and against the peace and dignity of the state.

PENALTY: A fine of up to \$1,000.00 or up to an amount equal to twice the amount of payments wrongfully obtained, or imprisonment for not more than ten years, or both.
